Common Position Statement of Conservation, Animal Welfare, and Political Groups calling for a ban in Victoria on recreational shooting of native waterbirds

DATED: 4 December 2005

The endorsing organisations condemn the annual recreational shooting of native waterbirds on Victoria's wetlands and call on the Victorian State Government to immediately ban the activity.

RESOLUTION:

That the Victorian State Government immediately bans the recreational shooting of native waterbirds.

The endorsing organisations recognise that:

- 1. The activity of duck shooting is cruel and barbaric. On cruelty grounds the Victorian State Government's own Animal Welfare Advisory Committee (AWAC) recommended a permanent ban on recreational duck shooting in 1993, 1995, 1997, 2000 and 2003.
- 2. Wounding rates are unacceptably high. The activity relies on the use of a shotgun, not a rifle. Birds are frequently wounded by the spray of pellets and are cruelly left to die.
- 3. Native waterbirds down the east coast of Australia are at their lowest since annual surveys were commenced in 1984.
- 4. The Victorian State Government is ignoring both the environmental and ethical issues in condoning the activity.
- 5. The public at large supports a ban. A statewide AC Nielsen poll conducted in 2003 showed that 70% said 'Yes' in response to the question, 'Should the recreational shooting of Australian native waterbirds be permanently banned?'
- 6. Victoria ought take a national approach on duck shooting and follow the precedents of NSW, WA and Queensland State Labor Governments in banning the activity.
- 7. It is disturbing that the Victorian State Government permits children from the age of 12 years to participate in this cruel and unethical activity.
- 8. Regions like Kerang and nearby Boort and Donald, as well as Gippsland and Geelong, and other areas throughout Victoria have diverse wetlands, over 150 species of native waterbirds and some significant indigenous heritage sites. The Victorian State Government should encourage wetlands tourism as an economic boost to regional and country Victoria, as occurred with penguins at Phillip Island and the Southern Right Whales at Warrnambool. Recreational duck shooting is clearly incompatible with wetland environmental-tourism.
